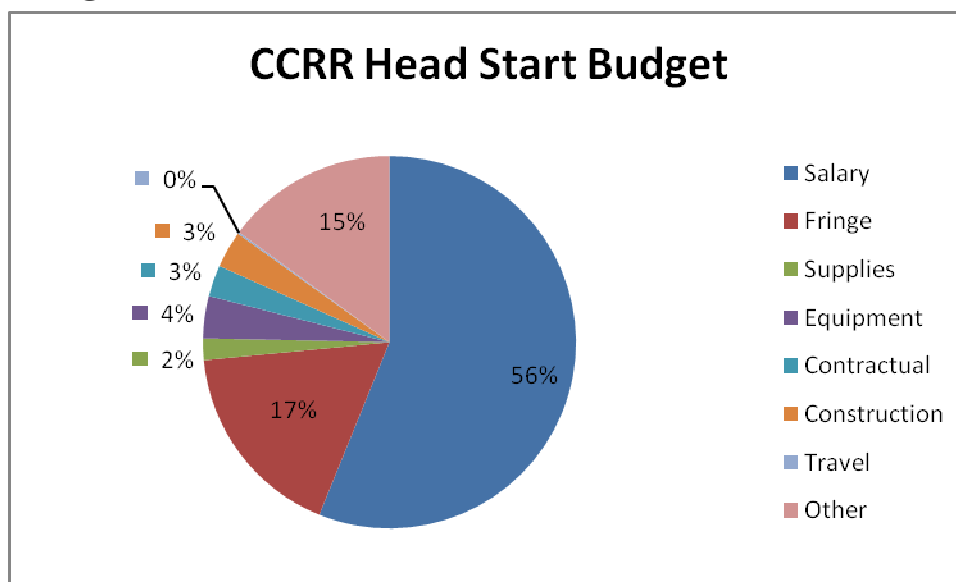
Funding Sources

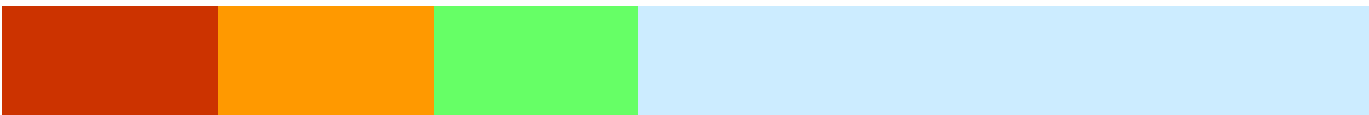

94% of enrolled children received dental exams

94% of enrolled children are up to date on a schedule of medical care

Parent Involvement Activities

88% of families participated in a goal setting process resulting in a family partnership agreement

79% of families received emergency/crisis assistance and/or education services

Agency Efforts to Prepare Children for School

The four year old children served in the CCRR Head Start in 08-09 began the year at an average of 28% proficient across the developmental domains of social/emotional, physical, cognitive and language. In the spring, the children demonstrated progress on average of 62% to 90% proficient. The significance of this progress is further highlighted by the understanding that only 40% of the children had English as their primary home language.
